reading. The article is about
STRONG ROTARY CLUBS.

Here's what he says a
SUCCESSFUL CLUB should
do:

1. Assess. Find out what the members want. (A survey will be sent by the end of the week so we can find out.)
2. Emphasize. Social Aspects. (Fireside Chats, Christmas hayride, Haunted House)
3. Market. Same as #1. Find out what people want.
